Bridge End Garden workshop for Bell Day pre-school

Prior to the children breaking up for the school holidays, Nathan Doe, Senior Gardner at Bridge End Gardens and Colette Kerr, Events & Activities Officer ran a morning workshop consisting of 3 sessions; a treasure hunt, a talk on bugs and slugs and mindful art. It was received well by the children and staff and it is hope that a full dairy of summer workshops for pre-school and primary schools can be rolled out for Summer 2023.

FREE Summer Square Events (29th July – 2nd September)

The programme of FREE summer events in the Market Square every Friday in the school holidays (10am – 3pm) was organised for all to enjoy. The programme of events included:

- Fire Brigade & Police Crew
- Alice in Wonderland activities and storytelling by Saffron Hall & KD Productions
- Lord Butler Leisure, free face painting and crafts
- Saffron Walden Museum joined us with fun craft activities. They replaced Charles
 Dickens story performances by Half Cut Theatre who cancelled 72 hours prior to the
 event.
- Saffron Walden Cricket Club also stepped in at short notice with cricket activities.
 Unfortunately, Carver Barracks Display cancelled with 48 hours' notice.
- Off the Beaten Truck evening of food, drinks and music (chargeable)

As well as providing an activity for the events, each week acted as a showcase, public engagement event or promotional tool for each supplier. The only direct cost incurred by Saffron Walden Town Council was for face painting on one of the events.

Funding from Essex Activate provided a free hot meal for school aged children and young people who were eligible for benefits based free school meals or from low income working families. On average 24 vouchers were used each week, although funding allowed for 50 meals. Grant funding was also received from Essex Association of Local Council to fund two newspaper adverts prior to the events.

Saffron Walden Library attended every week with a pop-up stall and are interested in future collaborations with SWTS, noting the stall made a huge difference for the Library and increased membership.

Working collaboratively, KD Theatre Productions, Saffron Hall & Saffron Walden Town Council presented Alice in Wonderland on Friday 19th and Saturday 20th August 2022 in Bridge End Gardens, two performance on each day.

Following Saffron Hall's successful funding application to SWTC for the hire of the gardens, 35 free tickets for each of the four performances were made available for school aged children and young people, eligible for benefits based free school meals or from low income working families only.

It was a very touching and polished performance on her 'Bandura'; a plucked string folk instrument - the national musical instrument of Ukraine.

A delicious homemade buffet consisting of a selection of traditional sweet and savoury Ukrainian delights; all made by local Ukrainian women was provided for everyone to enjoy. It gave residents a chance to meet local people from Ukraine, learn a little about their traditions, culture and food, and learn a word or two of the language! Families were excited to have a photo opportunity with The Mayor, along with their national flag and a blue and yellow balloon arch back drop! Saffron Walden 'pop-up' Library joined in to share library stock with the children who engaged with the books and enjoyed the colouring in packs.

Direct expenses incurred for this event, totalling £250.00, were reimbursed from the Resilience Fund – Ukraine.
