Three local charities receive £5,000 from Mayor's Appeal

THE PREVIOUS Mayor of Saffron Walden Richard Porch, who raised funds for Uttlesford Foodbank, Uttlesford Clothing Bank and Open Door Counselling during his Mayoral year, presented £5,000 cheques to representatives of the three charities last week.

Said Cllr Porch: "It has not been easy given that the start of my Mayoral year was delayed because of Covid. Fund raising was further disrupted during the winter as restrictions were re-imposed. Despite the difficulties many people and organisations came together during the year to help me raise money and I want to take this opportunity to thank all of those involved."

"In addition to the £15,000 I distributed last week a further £1,500 from the Rotary Club and £146 from the Granta Chorale was paid directly to the charities to support their immediate cash flow. This money was raised during Christmas collections."

4

New mayor in office

A new Mayor and deputy have been appointed to Saffron Walden Town Council.

The new Saffron Walden mayor is Councillor James de Vries. He has taken over the chains of office from outgoing Mayor Richard Freman, who stepped down from the role after his one-year term of office concluded.

Mayor de Vries will be supported in his role by his wife Sheila de Vries, the Mayress.

His three chosen mayoral charities are Unlended, Citizens Advice Bureau, Support 4 Sight which assists people living with sight loss, and Accuro which supports people with a disability in West Essex.

The Deputy Mayor is Councillor Dr Richard Freeman.

The town council processed through Saffron Walden to a "Churching Service" at St Mary's.

In March 2020 the town council split the responsibilities of the Mayor with a new position of Leader of the Council. The Leader of the Council is Councillor Paul Gadd.

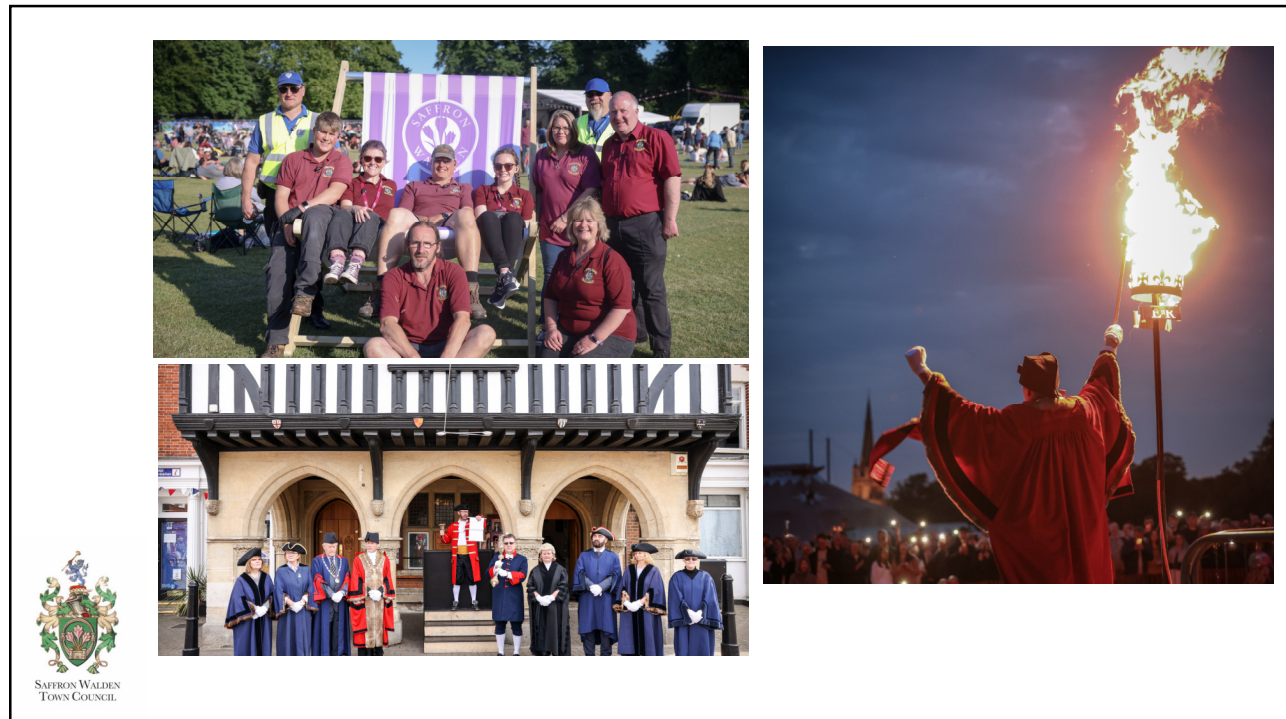

TOWN'S NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN GAINS MASSIVE APPROVAL

93% of referendum turnout vote in favour of development control

SAFFRON WALDEN Town Council has announced that the Saffron Walden Neighbourhood Plan was overwhelmingly approved at the referendum held last week and will now proceed to be formally adopted.

In the referendum, 93% of votes cast were in favour of adoption of the Neighbourhood Plan, with 7% against. The votes cast represented a turnout of 18%. Once adopted, the Plan will be used in assessing as within, including views and the impact of traffic

Independent Examiner gives thumbs up to Saffron Walden Neighbourhood Plan

VOLUNTEERS FROM the Neighbourhood Plan working group have been meeting prospective voters to discuss the proposed new policies.

Said Mike Hibbs: "The Plan has been examined by the Independent Examiner and found to be sound so if it is approved it will become legally binding on Uttlesford District Council and on Government Inspectors when considering planning applications."

The Examiner said: "The Plan has a clear vision and is supported by well-articulated objectives." And while the Plan cannot say where or how many houses should be built in Saffron Walden it can say that new developments should meet housing need and include more affordable housing.

"The plan allows us to set standards for the design of new developments. Many people in Saffron Walden are concerned about the environment and the Plan includes policies requiring new developments to have tree lined streets, grey water recycling, cycle paths and pedestrian routes to nearby infrastructure."

"The Plan also calls for an Arts Centre, a Health Centre, a new Sports Centre and for community woodland. A vote in favour will ensure Uttlesford District Council include these policies in future planning decisions."

"The Neighbourhood Plan has been drawn up by a working group primarily composed of local residents with no political affiliations, together with a number of former and current councillors. It was started under a Conservative administration and its current membership includes former Conservative mayor Keith Eden, current RLU councillor Paul Gask, current Green councillor Trilby Roberts and myself (former LibDem Mayor), all of whom recommend its adoption."

The NP will be on the market again on Saturday and next Tuesday.

Town Council signs national pledge of 'Civility and Respect'

AS FURTHER evidence of its commitment to treat everyone with courtesy and respect Saffron Walden Town Council has signed the national 'Civility and Respect' pledge introduced by the National Association of Local Councils to encourage all local councils to commit to driving through positive changes in the workplace, supporting civil and respectful conduct.

The Council is the first in the Unstford District to sign.

The pledge commits the council to: treat all councillors, the clerk and all employees, members of the public, representatives of partner organisations and volunteers with civility and respect in their role; put in place a training programme for councillors and staff; sign up to a Code of Conduct for councillors; have in

place good governance arrangements including staff contracts and a Dignity at Work policy; commit to seek professional help at early stages should civility and respect issues arise; commit to calling out bullying and harassment if and when it happens; continue to learn from best practice in the sector and aspire to being a role model/champion council, for example via Local Council Award Scheme; support the lobbying for the change in legislation to support the Civility and Respect Pledge including sanctions for elected members where appropriate.

In further support of the Council's commitment to the pledge Town Clerk Lisa Courtney recently supported a national training course for fellow Clerks, sharing details of best work practices and procedures.

SAFFRON Walden residents and dignitaries paid tribute to those who lost their lives in war with an Armistice Day service and Remembrance Day parade.

At the Sunday's Remembrance Day parade, Saffron Walden Mayor James de Vries was joined by representatives from Saffron Walden Town Council, Saffron Walden Royal British Legion, and members of the army, police and uniformed groups.

The procession began at the Gardens Road in Jubilee Gardens at 10.30am, and headed to the war memorial for the two minutes' silence at 11am and the laying of wreaths.

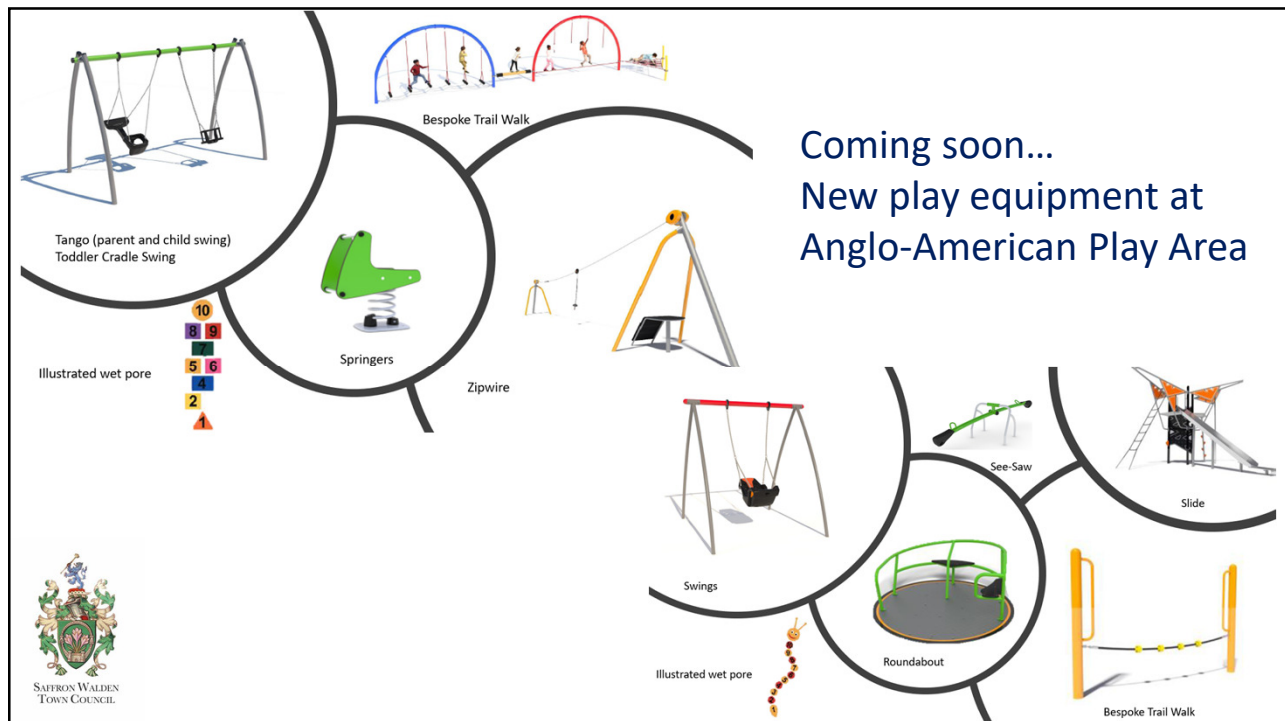
