BACKGROUND ON SWCFC

- Formed in June 2017 following merger between Saffron Walden Town FC Youth, and Spartak 78 YSC
- FA Charter Standard Community Club
- Now has over 1,000 registered players across 75 teams from U7-U18, and Mini Soccer School with c. 80 players
- Linked to 'Step 5' senior club Saffron Walden Town FC, and has separately run Girls' section – Saffron Walden PSGFC, with around 300 registered players
- Registered Charity (Saffron Walden Community Youth Sports Club – Charity Number 801764)
- Essex FA Charter Standard Community Club of the Year
 2018
- The club currently plays and trains at c20 different venues in and around Saffron Walden.....



WHY WE NEED ANOTHER 3G AGP

- Further growth in participation and in the club will be constrained without a 3G
 AGP
- SWCFC currently has 55 teams and a thriving Mini Soccer School. Our Girls' club has a further 20 teams
- Around half of our 1,000 players are currently able to play or train within the town at SWHCS. The other half need to travel to facilities in outlying villages, which are fully stretched
- A 3G AGP at Catons Lane is genuinely "walkable and in the Town Centre
- A 3G AGP would be available for use in all weathers, increasing game time and meaning significantly fewer cancellations
- A 3G AGP would reduce the pitch maintenance demands on our volunteers
- An increasing number of nearby towns and villages often with a less obvious business case than Saffron Walden – have multiple 3G AGPs
- Many rival clubs have 3G AGP stadia for financial security




What will it cost?

- > Equipment store in East Side




Catons Lane – Football Hub





Used for all matches at Catons Lane


Used for Lime Avenue and AAPF pitches (even when Club closed)

Financial security for SWTFC

Pitch hire income - £80k to £100k per annum at SWCHS replicated

Significant additional bar and food revenue for STWFC, especially at weekends

Possible ground share income up to £40k per annum

More Community Club players and parents attending Bloods matches

More potential revenue from pitch side adverts, naming rights etc

Profits to boost playing budget and other capital project improvements

Sinking fund of £30kpa invested to replace carpet every 12-15 years
