☐ **Pre-2019** – Formerly: Garden Room / Day Centre – providing hot meals for older residents ☐ March 2020 - Premises closed prior to pandemic - discussions between SWTC and UDC over several years □ November 2022 – Partnership planning with EE and UCAN commences ☐ January 2023 – Warm Welcome Hub moves from Town Hall □ 15 March 2023 – announcement of signed lease agreement for a10-year tenancy, and Jubilee Hub Partnership formed ☐ April 2023 – Jubilee Hub opens its doors ☐ **December 2023** – Lease, extended to a16-year lease





When would you be most interested in attending activities at the Jubilee Hub?




Count of When would you be most interested in attending activities at the Jubilee Hub?

I feared these photos would be lost, as the mobile phone and laptop are disused. Some of the family photos hold priceless memories and I'm so grateful

I live in a sheltered community of 31 tenants, all of us on medication, and we have greatly benefited from being able to make appointments online and being shown how to use the NHS APP since we joined the sessions.
